The celebration of Easter is prolonged throughout the fifty days of the Easter season. The fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated as one feast day, sometimes called the "Great Sunday." **Today**, Sunday 8 April, is **Divine Mercy Sunday**. **Mon 9 Apr** is the **solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord**. Mary gave herself entirely to the person and to the work of her Son. The Irish bishops have designated **Sunday and Monday** as days of **prayer for the protection of human life** (see note below on protecting human life).

**Wed 11 Apr** is the **memorial of St Stanislaus**, bishop of Krakow, Poland, 1072-1097.

**The Joy Of Life (Amoris Laetitia):** Over recent weeks, this letter written by Pope Francis for the World Meeting of Families, has been the subject of discussion by a number of people in our parish. We thank all who attended and in particular we are grateful to the facilitators who guided the discussions. We appreciate the cooperation of the schools in this project.

Our free **Diocesan Family Fun Day** in preparation for the World Meeting of Families (WMOF) will take place at **Tipperary Racecourse** on **Sunday 29 April** from 1.00pm to 4.30pm. ## Protecting Human Life: "The Positive Effects of Article 40.3.3 – A Culture of Life"

Many thousands of Irish people are alive as a direct result of the enactment of the Eighth Amendment, who might otherwise never have been born. This is partly because there was an inevitable interval between the thought of having an abortion and that thought being put into action. That interval allowed women, often with the support of family members, partners or pregnancy care agencies such as our own Cura, to consider other, more constructive, options.

Quite apart from the numbers of lives that were saved as a result of Article 40.3.3, expectant parents who experience a crisis pregnancy have been culturally supported in making the decision in favour of life and in avoiding a decision which many of them may have regretted afterwards. This cultural support was not simply in the fact that Irish society had made a public statement of principle about the right to life, but also because the structures of society, including healthcare facilities, were not deployed, as they are in many countries, to promote or facilitate the taking of life as an appropriate social response to crisis pregnancy."
