LAUDATO SI : PRAISED BE TO YOU

Pope Francis in his encyclical calls us all to care for the earth on which we live. That compassion and care runs through all his writings and sayings. He says 'the harm we have inflicted on the Earth by our irresponsible use and abuse of God-given goods. Addressed to every person living on this planet, the document serves as a stinging critique of humanity's treatment of the environment, urgently calling for action. Stating that the Earth is among the most abandoned and maltreated of the poor, Pope Francis claims the violence present in our hearts is reflected in the symptoms of sickness evident in the soil, water, air and all forms of life.

SOME WATER FACTS: 70% of the earth's surface is covered in water. Only 0.75% is available for use by life forms. 65% of our water is pumped from underground. Water is a finite resource and we are using more than the earth can provide. We are using 70% more water now than we did 30 years ago. Each person uses 119 litres of water per day i.e. 26 gallons. It takes 39,000 gallons of water to produce one motorcar,

250 gallons to produce one ream of paper and

150 gallons to produce a loaf of bread.

Taking a shower uses 32 litres but taking a bath uses 80 litres.

15 billion litres of water are used in the production and disposal of junk mail every year. A dripping tap wastes 15 litres of water a day. A leaking toilet wastes 45 litres a day.

It takes 1,500 litres of water to produce one kg of cereal.
