MONDAY 15 AUGUST : Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. All the feast days of Mary mark the great mysteries of her life and her part in the work of redemption. The central mystery of her life and person is her divine motherhood. Mary's Immaculate Conception (Dec. 8) marks the preparation for that motherhood, so that she had the fullness of grace from the first moment of her existence, completely untouched by sin.

Her whole being radiated divine life from the very beginning, readying her for the exalted role of mother of the Saviour. The Assumption completes God's work in her since it was not fitting that the flesh that had given life to God himself should ever undergo corruption. The Assumption is God's crowning of his work as Mary ends her earthly life and enters eternity. The feast turns our eyes in that direction, where we will follow when our earthly life is over.

SATURDAY 20 AUGUST is the memorial of St Bernard, abbot and Doctor of the Church.
