Pope Francis on Marriage and Family:

- 'The family is the first school of human values, where we learn the wise use of freedom. Certain inclinations develop in childhood and become so deeply rooted that they remain throughout life, either as attractions to a particular value or a natural repugnance to certain ways of acting.' (Amoris Laetitia 274)
- 'A small step in the midst of great human limitations can be more pleasing to God than a life which appears outwardly in order, but moves through the day without confronting great difficulties.' (Amoris Laetitia 305)
- 'The decision to marry should never be encouraged unless the couple has discovered deeper reasons that will ensure a genuine and stable commitment.' (Amoris Laetitia 211)
- 'Young love needs to keep dancing towards the future with immense hope. Hope is the leaven that, in those first years of engagement and marriage, makes it possible to look beyond arguments, conflicts and problems and to see things in a broader perspective. Hope also bids us to live fully in the present, giving our all to the life of the family, for the best way to prepare a solid future is to live well in the present.' (Amoris Laetitia 219)

Solidarity: we know that God will ask each of us, "What did you do for your brother? (cf. Genesis 4:9-10). The globalization of indifference, which today burdens the lives of so may of our brothers and sisters requires all of us to forge a new worldwide solidarity and fraternity capable of giving them new hope and helping them to advance with courage amid the problems of our time and the new horizons which they disclose and which God places in our hands.
