Today Sunday 20 January is the World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees. There are over 250 million migrants worldwide, of whom 22.5 million are refugees. They are searching for somewhere to live in peace, and often must be willing "to risk their lives on a journey that is often long and perilous, to endure hardships and suffering, and to encounter fences and walls built to keep them far from their goal" (Pope Francis). Urged by these words of Pope Francis concerning the plight of thousands of people across the world who are migrants or refugees, it is important that we come together to remember and pray for them. A particular concern must be the many children, often orphaned, who migrate alone, unaccompanied, to escape poverty and violence. "Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but him who sent me" (Mark 9:37). Monday 21 Jan is the memorial of St Agnes, virgin and martyr.

Thursday 24 Jan is the **memorial of St Francis de Sales**, bishop and doctor of the Church. He is regarded as one the great spiritual writers of the Church.

Friday 25 Jan is the **feast of The Conversion of Paul**, apostle. Today also marks the end of the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**. "Unity of action leads to full unity of faith" (*Ut Unum Sint*, 40). See note below.

Saturday 26 Jan is the **memorial of Ss Timothy and Titus**, bishops. They worked closely with St Paul on his missions.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity: Last Friday (18 Jan) saw the beginning of the week of prayer. It was prepared this year by Christians from Indonesia. About ten per cent of Indonesians are Christians from various traditions. There is a great diversity of ethnicity as well as language and religion in the country as a whole. Inevitable tensions arise in politics, business, justice, and distribution of wealth. Christian communities in Indonesia come together to find just responses in this fraught situation. They have taken inspiration from the words of Deuteronomy: "Justice, and only justice, you shall pursue" (see Deut. 16:18-20). We pray that this worthy intention will inspire Christian communities in Ireland to work for justice in all aspects of life in our country.
