A Reflection on Easter: Cross and Crown. The Celtic cross has a unique shape derived from the union of an ordinary cross and a circle which is a crown. This combination teaches a great truth. In life there is an inclination within each of us to focus solely on either the cross or the crown. On the one hand, we may be given to seeing only the dark, painful sides of life or, on the other hand or at another time in life, we may be prone to seeing only what is bright and beautiful. The insight presented by the Celtic cross shows balance. There is more to life than pain and sin, than the dreary and disastrous. Jesus had to endure the cross before rising in the glory of the Resurrection. Similarly with us. The weight of the cross presses on us as we journey towards heaven. Yet, the great Easter message is that heartbreak, back-break, suffering and death do not have the last word. Cross and crown. There is no Easter without a Good Friday. Yet Calvary is not the end. There is no cross without an Easter Day. This is why we rejoice and are full of hope. The crown rounds off the cross in God's scheme of things.
